Again, these are good questions to ask of ourselves. We have so many voices in our lives; so many influences that if we don't stop every now & then and re-evaluate our situations, we may not notice if we are off-track. This is all about perception. If we are not in close relationship to God, we will not perceive correctly.

"Perception is not always accurate, but it sure seems convincing!"

A friend told me once that someone looked at her funny. What I mean is, this person had a look of disgust on their face and it was apparently directed right at my friend who was totally stumped by it. As far as she knew, there was no reason for the offense so... she asked the person about it. (Ha! What a concept, eh?!) Guess what the person said to her. There was no issue toward her, but there was an issue. Are you ready for it... it was gas. Yup, she had pain in her stomach and thus the look on her face. Don't always trust 'perception'.

Have you ever wondered why there are different reactions to God? Some people seem so free to be around Him, while others walk in a state of silence & fearful reverence. Some are so quick to trust, while others need more convincing. I know for myself that when I forget who God is, I quickly loose the right perspective. I am so prone to a fearful stance that it is embarrassing to me. Let's have a look at an example of different views that Jesus gave us:

I was afraid I might disappoint you, so I found a good hiding place and secured your money. Here it is, safe and sound down to the last cent.'							
•	If you notice, this is who God gave the amount to. Could it be that He, knowing the outcome, had hoped that somehow this person might finally get a revelation of who He was?just a thought.

	Now? What does this mean for us today?							
	We need God-inspired perception. This is only possible through revelation knowledge of who God is.							
	Jesus said, "My sheep listen to my voice, I know them, and they follow me." (John 10:27)							
•	Jesus is talking about here (such as: habits, traditions, goals & pursuits).							
•	He is also talking about We could simply obey Him; grudgingly. Or, we could serve (listen & follow) because we love His ways and understand His heart toward us.							
	Here's an interesting quote from the book, 'For this Cause' by Brian Houston:							

In life, you will have loyal friends, neutral acquaintances and possibly a few enemies. The way human nature would order relationships would be friends as the high ground, neutral acquaintances in the middle, and enemies as the lowest ground. But look at it this way: your loyal friends will stick with you in times of adversity, and support you in times of trouble. You may know who your enemies are, but there is no point in losing sleep over them. Even your enemies cannot ultimately hurt you, but a disloyal friend can.

During his prison term, PTL founder Jim Bakker was asked if he had lost any friends. His answer was profound: "No," he said, "I simply found out who my friends really were."
